

# 2017 JOHN DUVAL ELIGO SHIRAZ



**WINEMAKER:** John Duval  
**REGION:** Barossa and Eden Valleys, South Australia  
**VARIETALS:** Shiraz  
**MATURATION:** 20 months in 100% French oak hogsheads (54% new)  
**ANALYSIS:** 14.5% alc/vol | 6.19 g/L TA | 3.52 pH

**VINTAGE:** Excellent preceding winter and spring rains created good sub soil moisture levels which led to ample canopy coverage and a healthy fruit set. Summer was mild, which in combination with healthy yields resulted in vintage starting four weeks later than in 2016. Across the portfolio of releases from the 2017 vintage, the red wines show great flavor concentration, impeccable balance and an extra dimension of elegance.

**WINEMAKING:** Eligo epitomizes John Duval's unparalleled knowledge of Barossa's terroir and fruit. Traditional, low-intervention winemaking techniques ensure that this flagship wine is full of finesse and character. Submerged-cap fermentation takes place in small, stainless steel fermenters with a small portion undergoing extended maceration for up to two weeks to maximize color and flavor extraction.

**TASTING NOTES:** The nose shares attractive black fruit, anise and cloves. The palate is packed with a multitude of vibrant fruit layers and a commanding depth of flavor. Rich and rewarding, the dark fruit never stops. Layer upon layer of flavors keep developing upon the long finish with fine, integrated tannins. Powerful, yet still shows great finesse.
