**BACKGROUND:** The name 'Stump Jump' relates to the significant South Australian invention – the Stump Jump plough – a popular piece of machinery because of its ability to ride over stumps and gnarled "mallee" Eucalypt roots, saving valuable time by not stopping the draught horse. It is rumored that the inventor of the Stump Jump plough, had poor eyesight and required regular tests to ensure he could still operate machinery. The design of this label is inspired by an optometrist's eyechart.

**VINTAGE NOTES:** Good precipitation followed by a hot November meant more bunches, yet lighter fruit set. Where crops were smaller, berry size grew. The heat produced a fast flowering, set, and speedy berry development leading to an early veraison and the earliest start of vintage on record.

**TASTING NOTES:** A very easy drinking, maritime, warm-climate Cabernet Sauvignon. A core signature of blackcurrant and violets in the juicy palate delivers black fruits, cherry and currant with a touch of dried sage and a light freshness. The tannins are fine and polished.
