

2019 d'ARENBERG

THE CUSTODIAN GRENACHE



WINEMAKER: Chester Osborn
REGION: McLaren Vale, South Australia
VARIETALS: 100% Grenache
MATURATION: 9 months in seasoned French oak
ANALYSIS: 14.5% alc/vol | TA: 6.9 g/L | pH: 3.43

BACKGROUND: In 1959, Francis d'Arenberg (d'Arry) Osborn began bottling d'Arenberg wines under the now famous Red Stripe label. Today, d'Arenberg is helmed by his son, Chester Osborn, and the winery owns nearly one-third of McLaren Vale's mature Grenache bush-vines, and continues to celebrate the high critical acclaim for their coveted Grenache-based wines.

WINEMAKING NOTES: Small batches of grapes are gently crushed and then transferred to open fermenters. Foot treading is undertaken two-thirds of the way through fermentation; the wine is basket pressed and transferred to seasoned French oak to complete fermentation and mature. The barrel ferments are aged on lees, and there is no racking until final blending. This wine is unfinned and unfiltered.

TASTING NOTES: A delightful ruby red appearance. A lighter flavor profile than previous renditions of this wine. Some cherry and red berry characters, along with a touch of savoriness. A long, powerful finish with tannins that will unfurl with time in the cellar. One to watch.

ABOUT d'ARENBERG: One of the undisputed kings of Australian Shiraz and Rhone varietals, d'Arenberg has managed to turn individuality into an art form by doing a whole lot of little things differently. The original vineyards were established by Joseph Osborn in 1912 in the McLaren Vale region of South Australia. A century on, the estate has grown to 345 acres, and the mantle now rests with fourth-generation winemaker Chester Osborn. By maintaining a focus on traditional winemaking and nurturing their old-vine material, the Osborn clan has successfully established themselves as one of the country's leading producers of concentrated, characterful wines. Consistently ranked as one of the Top 100 Wineries in the world by Wine & Spirits Magazine, this reputation is clearly recognized globally.
