BACKGROUND & WINEMAKING: The name 'Stump Jump' refers to the significant South Australian invention - the Stump Jump plough. This popular piece of machinery pulled by a draught horse could ride over stumps, snags and gnarled "mallee" Eucalypt roots, saving valuable time. The grapes used in this wine are mostly from very old bush vines, and underwent gentle crushing, traditional open-tank fermentation, basket pressing and oak maturation prior to bottling.

VINTAGE NOTES: Winter and Spring rains were quite good. Cooler weather at flowering and fruit set, with a brief, intense heat wave reduced the crop significantly. A few warmer nights toward harvest helped the last sugar push. Yields were down significantly, the lowest in memory; however, quality is exceptional, delivering some of the best wines seen for years, with great color, fruit character, flavors and length.

TASTING NOTES: Fragrant aromas of strawberries, blackberries and raspberries on the nose. Intricate flavors of blackberries and cherries come at first, followed by wild strawberries and mulberries. Structure is rich and velvety, finely tuned by polished tannins. The mouth-coating and silky finish show finesse and are the perfect closure for this wine.
