### Review Summary

**97 pts** “The 2021 Sauvignon Wild screams class. It was a small vintage; poor flowering led to small crops, and a subsequent dry summer guaranteed intense concentration. It is firm and intense, almost punching you between the eyes with its drive created through a combination of acid and phenolics, which provide structure and ensure this is one that will age gracefully. Aromatically, however, it’s restrained and layered, offering everything from blackcurrant and nectarine to fennel. In summary, it’s a wine that has all the right bits in all the right places and follows it up with length and persistence.”
