

# 2019 d'ARENBERG

## THE DERELICT VINEYARD GRENACHE



**WINEMAKER:** Chester Osborn  
**REGION:** McLaren Vale, South Australia  
**VARIETALS:** 100% Grenache  
**MATURATION:** 12 months in new and seasoned French oak barriques  
**ANALYSIS:** 14.5% alc/vol | TA: 7.0 g/L | pH: 3.41

**BACKGROUND:** At a time when Grenache was considered unfashionable, Chester acquired many old-bush, overgrown and abandoned vineyards. These vineyards seem slightly dishevelled in appearance, “derelict,” but thanks to care and attention, they are producing very low yields of exceptional fruit.

**WINEMAKING NOTES:** Walking the vineyard rows and tasting grapes, Chester determines the ideal picking time for each individual vineyard. The Grenache was hand-picked, and after gentle crushing, transferred to open fermenters. The wine is basket-pressed and transferred to a mixture of new and old French oak to complete fermentation and mature for 12 months. The barrel ferments are aged on lees, there is no racking until final blending and no fining or filtration.

**TASTING NOTES:** Dark, intense deep purple-crimson in the glass. On the nose: striking notes of rhubarb, raspberry jam and redcurrant. The palate is soft and rich, showing a more full-body style of Grenache. A flow of red cherries, rhubarb and red plums are laced with a fine layer of cedar, introducing more dark-flavored characters like plums and hints of dark chocolate. Texture is firm and finely balanced.

**ABOUT d'ARENBERG:** One of the undisputed kings of Australian Shiraz and Rhone varietals, d'Arenberg has managed to turn individuality into an art form by doing a whole lot of little things differently. The original vineyards were established by Joseph Osborn in 1912 in the McLaren Vale region of South Australia. A century on, the estate has grown to 345 acres, and the mantle now rests with fourth-generation winemaker Chester Osborn. By maintaining a focus on traditional winemaking and nurturing their old vines, the Osborn clan is successfully established as one of the country's leading producers of concentrated, characterful wines.
